



# Learning Map for Year 2: Summer 2026

## Year 2 'Cities and Savannahs'

**Time:**

- Compare and sequence intervals of time.
- Tell and write the time to five minutes, including 'quarter past' and 'quarter to'.
- Draw the hands on a clock face to accurately illustrate a given time.

**Measurement:**

- Choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure mass (kg/g); temperature (°C); capacity (litres/ml) to the nearest appropriate unit, using scales, thermometers and measuring vessels.

The children will also develop a range of skills including:

- Learning to spell more words with contracted forms.
- Learning the possessive apostrophe.
- Using synonyms to make adventurous word choices.
- Using tenses consistently.
- Using commas to separate items in a list.
- Spelling polysyllabic words including words with suffixes.
- Using adverbs.

**Statistics:**

- Construct simple pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and simple tables.
- Ask and answer simple questions by counting the objects in each category and sorting the categories by quantity.

**RSE - TenTen Programme**  
Learning about friendships and family to help children to understand themselves and others.

Using class texts as a stimulus, the children will practice writing for many different purposes including: poetry, diary writing, letter writing and non-chronological reports.

**Fractions:**

- Recognise, find, name and write fractions  $\frac{1}{3}$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{2}{4}$  and  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity
- Write simple fractions for example,  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of  $\frac{2}{4}$  and  $\frac{1}{2}$ .

**Summer 1: To the Ends of the Earth**  
Jesus' appearances to the apostles, the Ascension, and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Retell the conversion of Saul on the road to Damascus. Learn about the fruits of the Holy Spirit. Make links between the fruits of the Spirit and the lives of saints and holy people.

**Summer 2: Dialogue and Encounter**  
The Parable of the Good Samaritan. Explore how love can rebuild communities. Judaism - the Torah: keeping the Sabbath (Shabbat), the role of the synagogue. Ask wondering questions about Jewish faith and practice.

**Great Fire of London (Summer 1):**

- Life in the 17th Century and the main events of the Fire.

- Discuss aspects that may have affected the spread of the Fire.
- Consequences of the Fire and how London was rebuilt after the fire.

- revisit and apply musical skills through Reflect, Rewind and Replay,
- Use of pulse, rhythm and pitch through performance.
- Listening while singing with greater expression, phrasing and control.

- Identify the physical and human features of Kenya.
- Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of London and Nairobi.
