What we are doing:

Religious Education

- We are implementing the new Religious Education Directory designing and teaching all new lessons
- Introducing the new Prayer and Liturgy Directory to enrich your child's spiritual development

Outstanding Teaching Across All Subjects

- Focusing on 'Independent Practice and Overlearning' this means giving children plenty of time to practise new skills until they become confident and automatic

Reading, Writing and Maths

- Refreshing our approach to Maths Mastery in Early Years and Year 1, prioritising accurate and fluent mathematics

- Securing core writing skills across the school, plus beautiful handwriting.

Supporting Every Child

• Developing our staff's expertise in Executive Functioning (the thinking skills that help children plan, focus attention, and manage tasks) and Sensory Circuits (activities that help children be ready to learn)

Home Learning

 Introducing digital educational tools alongside traditional homework to give your child more opportunities to practise independently/overlearning at home

What this means for your child:

Your child will receive consistently excellent teaching that helps them be ready to learn and build knowledge step-by-step. They will have plenty of opportunities to practise until they are confident, and we will quickly spot and fill any gaps in their learning.

Leadership and School Improvement

What we are doing:

Preparing for the New Ofsted Framework

- Training all staff on the 2025 Ofsted Framework, which applies from 10 November 2025 and uses a new 5-point grading system
- Using the new Ofsted toolkit to support our self-evaluation and continuous improvement against the new framework

Technology Upgrade

• Upgrading our IT infrastructure, including servers, devices, school management software and assessment tracking system

Curriculum Design

- Evolving our curriculum offer so that is ambitious, yet continues to be broad and balanced, and gives all pupils the knowledge they need to achieve and thrive in later life
- Maximising the benefits and unique advantages of our small Catholic primary school setting in terms of curriculum delivery and utilising staff expertise

What this means for your child:

 Building our understanding of the new Ofsted Framework for early years provision, ensuring we have a clear and ambitious vision for giving children the best start to their education

What this means for your child:

Children in our early years will be well prepared to reach a good level of development by the end of Reception, securing important foundational knowledge in literacy and mathematics.
